### **HAND KNITTING**

- Matching Set is defined as any 2 of the following articles: toque, hat, scarf, cowl, gloves, mittens, fingerless gloves, wrist warmers or boot toppers in co-ordinating or matching yarn choice.
- Fancy knit is defined as any stitch combination other than stockinette or garter.
- Small indicates articles less than 200 grams (approximately 2 balls of yarn).
- Large indicates articles more than 200 grams

## **RUGS**

All rugs must be Hand Made, no tufting guns or mechanically powered hooks. Rugs must be completely finished, including clipped and blocked where appropriate. Backing techniques include; hem stitched, rug twill, whipstitch and crochet. All entries must have a title and indicate whether original design, pattern or kit was used. Entrant is encouraged to comment on any unique technique or fibre used. Eg. Sari Silk, wool roving, reverse punch etc.

### **Class**

- 105. Mug Rug: Hand Hooked or Rug Punched measuring 6X6 inches
- 106. Hand Hooked Rug: Traditional Hand Hooking no less than 12X12 inch square or 15 inch diameter circle.
- 107. Rug Punch Needle: no less than 12X12 inch square or 15 inch circle.
- 108. Latch Hook: no less than 12X12 inch square or 15 inch circle.
- 109. Fabric Rug: Locker Rug, Toothbrush, Braided, Proddy or Penny.
- 110. Open: no less than 12X12 inch square or 15 inch circle. Multiple rug techniques may be used in combination.
