Regulations

- Exhibits will be accepted Wednesday from 6:00pm to 8:00pm. All exhibits must be in by 12 noon sharp on Thursday for judging.
- All exhibits must remain on exhibition until 5:00pm Sunday or will be disqualified and no prize money paid.
- All entries must be picked up at 5:00pm sharp on Sunday. If unable to pickup, please make arrangements with convenor.

Rules for Display

- Use clear glass containers, not of any value, which display flowers adequately. Milk bottles, wine carafes, narrow neck jars, etc, which hold flowers upright work well. Clean rocks or marbles may be used to weight vases for heavy-headed flowers.
- Containers should not outsize flowers.
- The fair is not responsible for containers. If they are not claimed at fair end, they will be recycled.
- Remove all dead, damaged and unnecessary foliage and flowers. No foliage should be in (under) the water in the container.
- Flowers should have their own attached foliage.
- One stem is one stem, not one branch.
- Bouquets should be done neatly, not stuffed into containers.
- Flowers must be grown by competitor, except in arrangement classes.
- Please name varieties, if known.
- Please ensure exhibit is entered in the right class, or it will not be judged.

1. Asiatic or Oriental Lily - 1 stem.
2. Calla Lily – 1 stem.
3. Asters - single - 6 stems.
4. Asters - double - 6 stems.
5. Asters - spider - 6 stems.
6. Chrysanthemums - 3 stems.
7. Cosmos - 6 stems.
8. Gladiolus - Miniature (up to 7cm (2.5")) - 1 spike.
9. Gladiolus - 1 spike.
10. Gladiolus - 3 varieties - 3 spikes – can be separate containers.
11. Gladiolus - 1 variety - 3 spikes.
12. Gloriosa Daisies - 6 stems.
13. Marigolds - single, 2" or under - 3 stems.
14. Marigolds - 5cm (2") or under - 3 stems.
15. Marigolds – 5cm (2") or over - 3 stems.
16. Michaelmas Daisies - 3 stems.
17. Pansies - 3 stems.
18. Snapdragons - 6 stems.
19. Sweet Peas - Annuals - 6 stems.
20. Sweet Peas - Perennials - 6 stems.
21. Zinnias – under 5cm (2") - 3 stems.
22. Zinnias – over 5cm (2") or larger - 3 stems.
23. Zinnias - cactus - 3 stems.
24. Ornamental grass – 6 stems.
25. Geranium – 3 flower heads on stem – any colour, own foliage
26. Dahlia, Lily or Waterlily – one blossom floating in water, in a glass bowl.
27. Open Class - annual or perennial - any flower not listed - 1 stem.
28. Dahlia - ball – 10cm (4") or larger - 3 blooms.
29. Dahlia - miniature ball 5-10cm (2"-4") - 3 blooms.
30. Dahlia - cactus - 23cm (9") or under - 1 bloom.
31. Dahlia - cactus - 23cm (9") or under - 3 blooms.
32. Dahlia - cactus - 23cm (9") or over - 1 bloom.
33. Dahlia - cactus - 23cm (9") or over - 3 blooms.
34. Dahlia - collarette - 3 blooms.
35. Dahlia - decorative - 23cm (9") or under - 1 bloom.
36. Dahlia - decorative - 23cm (9") or under - 3 blooms.
37. Dahlia - decorative - 23cm (9") or over - 1 bloom.
38. Dahlia - decorative – 23cm (9") or over - 3 blooms.
39. Dahlia - pompom – 5cm (2") or less - 3 blooms.
40. Rose - Hybrid Tea - red, variety named - 1 bloom.
41. Rose - Hybrid Tea - yellow, variety named - 1 bloom.
42. Rose - Hybrid Tea - white, variety named - 1 bloom.
43. Rose - Hybrid Tea - pink, variety named - 1 bloom.
44. Rose - Hybrid Tea - colour blend, variety named - 1 bloom.
45. Rose - Hybrid Tea - any colour not listed, variety named - 1 bloom.
46. Rose - Hybrid Tea - 1 container - 3 blooms, varieties named - 1 open, 1 half-open, 1 bud.
47. Rose - Hybrid Tea - 3 containers, 1 bloom each - 3 named varieties.

48. Rose - Peace - 1 bloom, any colour.
49. Rose - Floribunda - 1 spray, any colour.
50. Rose - Grandiflora - 1 spray, any colour.
51. Rose - Old Garden (Moss, etc.) - 1 stem.
52. Rose - Modern Shrub (Explorer, Austen, etc.) - 1 stem.
53. Rose - Polyantha (The Fairy, Verdun, etc.) - 1 stem.
54. Rose - Rambler or Climber (Galway Bay, New Dawn, etc.) - 1 stem.
55. Rose - Miniature (June Laver, Reiko, etc.) - 1 stem.
56. Rose - English Box Class - display of 6 Hybrid Tea blooms - any colour (construction of box shown below).

BOUQUET COLLECTION

57. **Shuswap Garden Club** Special Class: Collection of annual flowers, minimum of five species displayed in clear glass container. Will be judged on the number of kinds or varieties (named), arrangement, quality, and overall colour harmony.
Prizes: 1st-\$15, 2nd-\$10, 3rd-\$5.
58. **Shuswap Garden Club** Special Class: Collection of perennial flowers, minimum of five species displayed in clear glass container. Will be judged on the number of kinds or varieties (named), arrangement, quality, and overall colour harmony.

61. Cactus - any small type.
62. Cactus - any large type (no Christmas or orchid)
63. Dish Garden - using tropical HOUSE PLANTS.
64. Dish Garden - using cactus or succulents.
65. Flowering house plant - (other than 63 - 68). Other than African Violets.
66. Foliage house plant - no ferns.
67. Succulent - any type.

POTTED PLANTS

Pots not to exceed 45cm (18"). This rule will be enforced.

68. Begonia - tuberous upright, named if possible.
69. Begonia – tuberous hanging – any type.
70. Coleus - any type.
71. Fuschia - single or double upright, named if possible.
72. Fuschia – single or double hanging, named if possible.
73. Geranium – single or double, named if possible.
74. Geranium - trailing, named if possible.
75. Patio pot with variety of flowers – pot not to exceed 45cm (18")
76. Hanging House plant (hanger no longer than 24").

ARRANGEMENTS

Use fresh flowers unless stated. Flowers do not have to be grown by exhibitor.

Accessories not to be used unless stated. Suggestion: Height of arrangement = 1/3 container, 2/3 flowers. Try to use containers that relate to the type and size of the flowers - colour, size, shape, texture.

Prizes: 1st \$6.00, 2nd \$4.00, 3rd \$2.00

77. Foliage Arrangement.
78. Miniature - not over 8cm (3") either way including container.
79. Miniature - not over 13cm (5") either way including container.
80. Miniature - not over 20cm (8") either way including container.
81. Miniature – not over 13cm (5") including container – dried flowers.
82. Old Fashioned Flowers - in unusual container.
83. Oriental Style Arrangement.
- 84. Theme for 2017 Fair – “Canada 150”, Salmon Arm Fair 120” or “Something to crow about”**
85. Rose Arrangement - in Brandy snifter - using one colour of rose - Please have rose inside of snifter, neatly done, not under water, may be attached to pin or oasis (not visible), own foliage not necessarily attached.
86. Table Arrangement - up to 30 cm (12") using accessories if desired.
87. All white flower arrangement – greenery accepted.
88. Fresh arrangement in a basket.
89. Fill your boots – a fresh arrangement in any type of boot.
90. Fill your boots – a dried arrangement in any type of boot.
91. Fairy Garden – made in any container. Use your imagination, magic, fresh flower and plants, accessories, Gnomes and of course – Fairies.
92. Dried Arrangement in any container (except boots) – not to exceed 60cm (24")
93. Dried arrangement – wall hanging

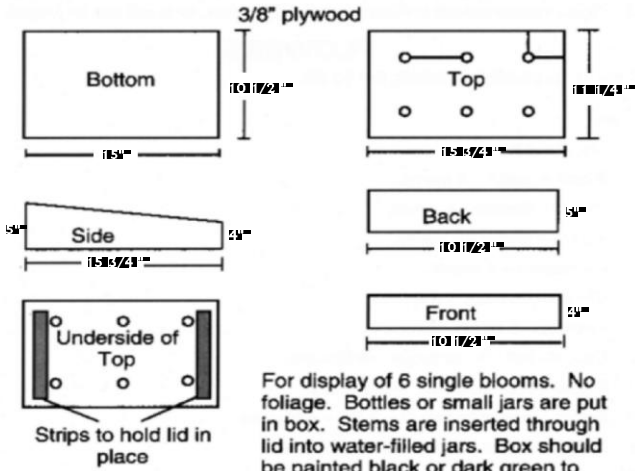
Children’s Classes

94. Children's Class (12 years & under) - Miniature arrangement 3" or under including container.
95. Children's Class (12 years & under) - Best bouquet, display in a clear glass container.
96. Children's Class (12 years & under) - Dried arrangement.
97. Fairy Garden - A garden for Fairies – must be made in any container. Use your imagination and magic, fresh flowers, plants, accessories and of course – FAIRIES

ENGLISH BOX CONSTRUCTION



For display of 6 single blooms. No foliage. Bottles or small jars are put in box. Stems are inserted through lid into water-filled jars. Box should be painted black or dark green to give good background.
