Regulations:

- In accordance with the National Farm Animal Care Council Code of Practice and the recommendation of the B. C. Sheep Federation and the B. C. Purebred Sheep Breeders Assoc., lambs born in 2015 and forward will not be accepted on the fairgrounds if the tail docking is not in compliance with regulation: 5.7 (pg. 41) of the Code of Practice. (Available at www.nfacc.ca)
- All animals shown must be the members' project(s) for the 2019 4-H year. Leaders please send by email, fax or regular mail the 4-H publication # 395 Livestock Project identification form to the convener.
- Animals cannot be accepted on the grounds without CFIA approved tags. **Please note that Pink metal CSIP tags are no longer approved.**
- Clubs will be required to have their stalls presentable to the public by 9:00am each morning of the fair. That is animals fed, water buckets filled and manure removed to a designated area.
- Clubs should make an effort to have members available between the hours of 9:00 am - 6:00 pm for interacting with the public to answer questions and concerns regarding their projects and 4-H.
- All animals must be on the grounds by 7:00 pm Thursday, September 5, 2019, and will be subject to a veterinary examination. Any animal found to be unfit for show will need to be removed as soon as possible.
- Stall cleaning, at the conclusion of the fair will be the responsibility of each club. If for some reason the club cannot accomplish this please see the convener to make other arrangements.
- **PLEASE NOTE:** In classes 9 & 12 Ewe with lamb at foot projects that are registered purebred ewes may be shown with **purebred** intact ram lambs at foot.
- Dress Code: 4-H members are to show in white or club show shirts or **club** T-Shirts and blue or black jeans. No shorts or non-club T-shirts.

20. 4-H Trim and Fit class: (no entry fee)
Team of two 4-H members to trim and fit for show a lamb in full fleece virgin wool. Washing to be done prior to class and carding may be done prior to the class by members participating but no trimming before entering the ring with the exception of belly wool only which may be shorn by hand or electric shears prior to entering the ring. Lamb must be present for the vet check on Thursday.

Clubs participating to supply trim stand & tarp for under the trim stand. Stabling of lamb may be with 4-H club participating. The lamb may or may not be a 4-H project. The lamb may be entered in the 4-H show if a project or in the open show.

Time limit of 90 minutes.

Team member #1. Hand trimming of the lamb. Answer questions regarding the use of equipment.

Team member #2. Cleaning of ears, nose & feet. Carding, trim feet & clean up wool. Assist as needed but no use of hand shears. May answer questions regarding the duties they are performing.
